GRANT PROGRAM: The Grant Panel chose the application of Eleanor and Frances Getman of Fort Plain, NY, to receive the first Dutch Barn grant for barn repair. A total of \$500 will be awarded toward repair of a sill and a sinking corner on their barn. The barn has been in the family for four generations. The Getman application stressed the work that has been done in the past to preserve the barn, and the plans to protect it in the future.

Other applications also revealed owners who have made extra effort to care for their barns. It was very hard to select one application from a total of eight. All the barns (and owners) needed assistance and were worthy of the grant — in fact, of much more help than the Society can give. However, we're happy to do this much. It is anticipated that the grant program will continue next year. The deadline is expected to be March 1. Thanks are expressed to an outstanding panel of Keith Cramer, Neil Larson, Russell Ley, Ruth Piwonka, and Ned Pratt, and to Shirley Dunn, the administrator of the grant program this year.

The members of the Panel will develop a brief list of guidelines to steer barn owners in the direction of repairs that are appropriate for a historic building and contribute to its long term survival. We would welcome any suggestions or an account of your experiences, good or bad, which might help some other owner. Jot them down and send them in, attention Grant Panel.
